06-07-1759, Lunenburg Co., VA, George Green of Halifax Co, to Robert Goodman of Hanover Co., for 40£, 500 ac, Lunenburg Co., on branches of Flat Rock Creek, ... along Brown's (Israel?) and William's (John?) lines,... to Leveret's. (Lunenburg Co., VA, DB 5:383-385, CO 6:11B).

Presumed to be a son of Robert Goodman of New Kent / Hanover Co, b, ca 1703, since the elder Robert's lands continued to be processioned in Hanover Co. at least to 1763, after which they were processioned naming Mary Goodman, presumed to be his widow.

Notes for ANSELM GOODMAN:

July 1777 Enlisted with Capt. Charles Gwatkins in Bedford Co., VA. Listed as Ansell E. and Ancill in other documents. Petition of Ansel Goodman, Russell Co., KY, on file in National Archives, photocopy of original in possession of Ronald E. Goodman. See below.

Book "Our Kin", Ackerly and Parker History of Bedford Co., VA, lists members of Bedford Co. Militia during the Revolution, includes: 7 Callaways, all officers, incl. a Col., Moses Fuqua, Ansel Goodman, ___ Goodman (John?), Harry Terrill, Peter Terrill, Samuel Fielding, John Lowry, Henry Lowry, Alexander Reynolds, Jesse Reynolds. Note intermarriages between Goodmans and others mentioned.

Jan 1778 Captured by Indians at The Blue Licks w/ Daniel Boone. Mentioned in several Boone biographies, and in Ansel's petition and other REv War petitions by others also captured.

1778 Wife Edith in Bedford. VA State Papers. states: "Captivated by Indians".

Aug 1778 Escapes to Ft. Harrod, then returns to Bedford in 1799. per his petition of 1832.

Anselam Goodman and John Goodman were taxpayers in Bedford Co., VA. re: "Virginia Taxpayers 1782-87 other than those published by the US Census Bureau", by Fothersgill and Naugle, 1978.

1790 NC census. Possibly same person listed as Ansylem in, Stokes Co., with 1 male 16+, 2 males under 16, 4 females, no slaves.

Adair Co. 1819 Tax List: Goodman, Ansel, Snr., Marcus Huling's Company

In Adair / Russell Co., KY in 1820, 1830 census.

10-29-1832 files petition for Rev War pension in Russell Co., KY, aged 80. DM 11C28-30,

12-27-1832 "Goodman, Ansel to Polly Walton - issued December 22, 1832, Bondsman: Price Lambert, m. by: Thos. P. Holland December 27, 1832, Wilson Co. ". No certainty that this was same Ansel as b. ca 1752. However, see following.

1840 Ansel Goodman died intestate in Wilson Co., TN. Robert Goodman listed as only creditor, money lent 12-25-1832. Original document, copy on file Wilson Co., TN Library microfilm. Difficult to read.

3. JOHN JAMES⁶ GOODMAN (*ROBERT⁵, ROBERT⁴, BENJAMIN³, BENJAMIN², WILLIAM¹*) was born Abt. 1750 in Hanover Co., VA, and died Aft. 1791 in TN or KY. He married EPHARILLA THORPE Abt. 1772 in VA. She was born Abt. 1754 in by family tradition, on ship to America from Ireland, and died Aft. 1810 in KY.

Notes for JOHN JAMES GOODMAN:

In Tennessee Tidbits, 1778-1914, Vol. 1, compiled by Marjorie Hood Fischer, found:

Aug 1790, Greene Co., TN Court Minutes, #/170. Robert and Amos Goodman, children of John Goodman, were ordered committed to the care of John Richardson until further orders. Stephen and Sarah and Rachel Goodman were committed to the care of Joseph Richardson.

Indications are that John (aka: James, or John James) Goodman abandoned most of his family in Greene Co., leaving them in the care of the Richardson in-laws, and taking only eldest sons John and Robert with him to Wilson Co., TN abt. 1791.

Notes for EPHARILLA THORPE:

Possible father / relations - In "Virginia Colonial Militia", 1651-1776, Certificates:

Name: Wm. Thorp. Comment: native of Virginia, Sergt. 1755-1762 in the late French war. Certificate signed by Chas. Scott, Brig.-Genl., that he was then regularly discharged. Court Name: Bedford Court Date: Dec 1779

Name: John Thorp. Comment: deceased, regular soldier under Genl. Forbes in 1758, and then departed this life. Wm. Thorp, a native of Virginia and heir-at-law of John Thorp, deceased. Court Name: Bedford Court Date: Jan 1780

Name: Thos. Thorp. Comment: Corporal in the late French war, 1759-1762. Court Name: Bedford Court Date: Jan 1780

Any of the above could have been the father of Epharilla Thorp. However, because only John Thorp was deceased, and Robert Hope Goodman's letter states that his grandfather "married a Miss Thorpe daughter of a Widow lady", the John Thorp who served under Gen. Forbes is the most likely candidate.

Notes for ANSEL GOODMAN:

1810 Adair Co., KY census, Ansel Goodman, 1 male under 10, 1 male 10-15 [possibly the John who shows up in 1820 Adair census, below], 1 male 26-45 (Head of Household, Ansel), 2 females under 10, 1 female 26-45 (wife). Presumed father Ansel Goodman b ca 1752, and probable brothers Andrew & Jesse also in same county.

1820 Adair Co., KY census, Ansel (hard to read first name) Goodman 2 males under 10 [Ron: My money is on one of these kids as Martin b ca 1814, later of Spencer Co. 1860 census!], 1 male 16-18, 1 male 16 to under 26, 1 26 under 45, 2 females under 10, 1 female 26 under 45, 3 in Agriculture. Andrew Goodman & elder Ansel are still in Co., plus Marcus (possibly Martin, b. 1798), and John, possibly s/o Ansel b. ca 1780, who was 10-15 in the 1810 census.

Need to find details for this family in 1830, possibly Anslam, in Bath Co., KY, p. 206.

Presumption that Martin Goodman, b. ca 1814, later of Spencer Co., IN, was a son of this Ansel / Anslam is by name of Martin's son Ansel, b. ca 1843 in IN. Plus, presence of elder Ansel Goodman, also in Spencer Co, IN, at same time, next line to Martin on census, incorrectly indexed by Ancestry.com as "aurel", due to mis-reading of old script on census sheet.

Notes for MARTIN GOODMAN:

Martin Goodman is listed with land warrant in Adair Co., KY, with 50 ac. on Roaring Lilly Creek, in 1822. Also listed is Anslow (Anselm?) Goodman, with 50 ac. on Big Lilly Creek, Adair Co in 1822. Based on dates and proximity, these two were probably related, perhaps brothers. They may have been sons of Ansel Goodman, as Ansel also lived in Adair Co., and a Martin Goodman is later found in Spencer Twp, IN 1860 with son Ansel.

The 1st Sarah Goodman, b. 1778, appears to be a 1st wife, before Sally Elsbury, not previously known to or disclosed by Robert Hope Goodman. This would explain daughter Mary Goodman, b. 1800, as well as the 1800 census entry for John Goodman in Oglethorpe Co., GA, below.

Sally (Elsbury) Goodman did not list her own birth date. Her name appears only as originator of the bible record.

One or more of the children of John Goodman and Sally Elsbury may have died in infancy, as Robert Hope Goodman's letter says that only 3 children were born to this couple, (to his knowledge or recollection). This may indicate that only 3 of those were still living when he was a young boy.

It is presumed that Sarah Goodman b. 1779, is John Goodman's 3rd wife, Sarah Martin.

Stephen Goodman b 1777, is most likely John Goodman's brother, of Barren / Hart Co., KY, and is listed separately from others of the family.

Polly Goodman is currently unidentifiable, but could have been Mary Goodman, Polly being a common nickname for Mary.

Sadly, only birth dates are listed in the abstract in this book, and no marriage or death dates that could further identify & clarify this record.

John Goodman was in Oglethorpe Co., GA before 1794. Source: "List of Tax Defaulters year 1794, Oglethorpe Co.", 12/4/1794 issue of Southern Sentinel & Universal Gazette, Augusta, GA.

1800 US Census, Oglethorpe Co., GA: John Goodman, Capt. McCarlyle's Dist., 00010-20100-00: 1 male, 26-44, 2 females under 10, 1 female 16-25.

This entry would seem to indicate that John Goodman had an unnamed 1st wife, probably the Sarah Goodman b. 9/29/1778 in the bible record, and married abt 1796, who was mother of Mary Goodman b. 2/29/1800, and one other daughter that died young, and that she died or they divorced before John Goodman married Sally Elsbury in 1806.

[Note: This source apparently has wife as Sally, which seems correct, as it was she who wrote John Goodman's bible record in 1815. John Goodman's bible, which unhappily lists births only, seems to indicate that 1st wife was Sarah, b. 9/29/1778, and 3rd wife was also named Sarah, b. 4/5/1779.

Notes for SUSANNA A. GOODMAN:

In AA CD# 229, Joseph Richardson m. Susanna Goodman Jul 1, 1790. Recorded in Green Co., TN.

Since Susanna is not mentioned in the 1790 Greene Co. TN Court reference, it is likely that Susanna was an elder sister of Robert, Amos, and Stephen Goodman, and married Joseph Richardson just prior to her father's (John Goodman) court action.

Susanna may have later remarried in Barren Co., KY, where many of her siblings had also removed to by early 1800s:

ROBERT GOODMAN, SR., made his will January 19, 1858, and it was recorded March 14, 1859. [Wilson Co., TN, W&I, 1858-1863, p. 62f] He names his wife, Rhoda Goodman, who was to receive his land in the 24th Civil District; and others mentioned were the heirs of Albert Goodman and heirs of Robert Goodman, Jr., "the names of whom I have forgotten". He appointed James Thompson his executor. Witnesses were Charles Turner Hewgley and J. W. Hardy.

Per Robert Carver's family research: "The first member of our GOODMAN FAMILY to appear in the records of Wilson Co., TN, was ROBERT GOODMAN. According to the family Bible, he was born February 27, 1775. He was listed in the 1850 census as being 75 years old and is not in the 1860 census. Living with him in 1850 was his wife, RHODA GOODMAN, who was born about 1787. She was his second wife. DOCTOR GOODMAN (it is not known why he was so called) married RHODA LANDRUM in Wilson County, TN, on September 10, 1839, The family Bible clarifies this issue for us, as ROBERT's first wife is not named, but their marriage date is given as being February 27, 1795, and her death date as March 10, 1825. [GOODMAN FAMILY BIBLE, in possession of Mrs. Novella Bond Jackson, Sharon, TN.]"

I am a descendant of Matthew Harper, born about 1770 in SC and his third wife, Sarah Jane Goodman Richardson Harper, born VA. 1st. wife was Elizabeth Pierce, married in Spartenburg, SC 2nd Judah Reynolds m. Barren co. and Sara Jane also m. in Barren co.

Dear Florrie

I have seated myself to write you a letter one from me, - I have intended for a long time to write you, but you know how I am worked and how little time or chance I have to write - and as your mother and Charlie were writing to you every week and I hearing from you often, I did not feel the necessity of writing as I would have done had it been otherwise. I have very little news to write. Your mother and Charles have informed you of the passing events in our City. I enclose to you a check on New York for \$150.00 dollars - which you will please hand over to Mr. Harris and ask him to receipt for it. I will send him the balance as soon as I can. You wrote to your mother some time since wanting to know more of the history of the Goodman family. She in her letter gave you some outline of it. I thought I would give you a history of the family more in detail as I learned it of my Father. The Goodman family were among the early settlers of Virginia, or at least we can trace them back some 160 to 170 years, they settled in that part of the country between Yorktown and Richmond. They were well off, had fine estates and lived like Gentlemen and were well educated for people in that day and time, stood high as noble and true men. That branch of the family that my Father sprang from settled before his birth (which was 100 years ago) in Hanover County.

My grandfather James Goodman being a young man of adventurous and roving disposition went up into Bedford County - it was then a frontier County and there married a Miss Thorpe daughter of a Widow lady and Scotch by birth who was a noble patriotic woman and stood so high with the Whigs in the Revolutionary War in that part of the Country. He (my grandfather) settled there in the mountains of Virginia and there raised his family - until my father John Goodman being the eldest son was 18 years old. That beautiful Country Middle Tennessee and Kentucky was then being settled up by Virginians. My grandfather took John and Robert his two eldest sons they being 18 and 16 years old and went into Middle Tennessee and settled on a tract of rich land which was then or afterwards in Wilson County. My father then being but 18 years old left his Father and came to Georgia and settled near the Cherokee Corner 8 miles below where Athens now is, it was a wilderness then; the Cherokee Indians owning the land to a point below it, he settled in Oglethorpe County near the Indian line in the outside settlements or frontiers, and after a few years married a Miss Elsbury - they had a very hard life of it for a few years the Whites and Indians were at War - fighting and hiding out from the Indians nearly all the time - he had two brothers-in-law killed in battle by the Indians, after the birth of 3 children his wife died.

His second wife was a Miss Martin from South Carolina which was my Mother. My Father had a great uncle a bold adventurous man by the name of Ansel Goodman that went West and joined himself to Daniel Boon the Great explorer of Tennessee and Kentucky-he was captured by the Indians and was held a prisoner for a year but finally made his escape and got back to Virginia. My Grandfather James Goodman by leaving the older settlements and going on to the frontiers raised up his family comparatively illiterate - my father John Goodman followed in his steps and raised up his family in the same way - they were both high minded honorable men and remarkable for their honesty - but suffered their familys to become illiterate through their love of back woods life. And as back woods men rarely ever accumulate anything their familys became poor and illiterate and comparatively degraded on account of this backwoods life. I when quite a boy and just started out in life saw how the matter stood and I determined to try and elevate my family and raise them up from this illiterate and social degradation. I have had a great deal to contend with and have worked hard all my life, I have educated my son and am educating my daughter and am trying to place them in a good social position and it will rest with Charlie and yourself to maintain it. And see to it that you do not let the family go down again into illiterate and social degradation - and remember that NO GOODMAN - no one of my blood has ever been guilty of a mean and dishonest act that I have ever heard of - they have ever been noble true honest and honorable men.

Reserve this letter for when I am dead and gone it may interest more when you are old (if you should live to be old) than it will now-

ROBERT H. GOODMAN, PIONEER, IS DEAD

[THE ATLANTA JOURNAL, August 28, 1909]

He Built One of Atlanta's First Houses on Heap of Ruins - Was in his 91st Year, and Is Survived by 12 Grand-Children.

Robert H. Goodman, who came to Atlanta when it was an ash heap and built one of the first houses that rose from the ruins of the war, died in this 91st year Friday afternoon at the home of his son, C. M. Goodman, 257 Peeples street. His passing removes one of the kindest and most historic personalities the city ever knew.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock in the Church of the Incarnation, West End. The interment will be in Westview. Mr. Goodman is survived by his son, C. M. Goodman of Atlanta, his daughter Mrs. Florence Spracklen, of Philadelphia, and by 12 grandchildren, 6 by his son and 6 by his daughter. Among these is Robert Goodman, third, 1-year old baby son of Robert Goodman, second, who was formerly a well-known Atlanta newspaper man, and who now resides in New York City. The pall bearers will be Captain G. J. Dallas, Hubert L. Culberson, W. S. Kelley, and three of the grandsons, P. M. Goodman, C. M. Goodman, Jr., and H. T. Goodman.

Mr. Goodman, sometimes popularly known as Captain Goodman, was born on a farm near Athens, February 21, 1819. He was the son of John Goodman, one of Georgia's pioneers from Virginia. As a young man he moved to Athens entered the mercantile business, played a notable part in the town's civic affairs as chairman of the street committee and then at the outbreak of the civil war enlisted in a company known as Mell's volunteers. He became lieutenant and subsequently Captain in Cobb's legion. In the midst of the war his health temporarily broke. He came back to Georgia and joined the state troops near Rome, where he served with great bravery and distinction.

FOUND CITY IN RUINS.

In July, 1865, when Atlanta was a pile of smoking ruins and scarcely a building stood to mark the city's site, Captain Goodman set forth from Athens in a wagon to drive to Atlanta through the open country. On his way here he stopped at Decatur, bought a little store house, took it to pieces largely with his own hands, mounted it on the wagon and came on until he reached the corner of what is now Peachtree street and Auburn avenue. There he put the timbers of his little store together again and started a general merchandise business. It marked the beginning of the present-day Atlanta.

He continued in that vicinity until 1878. Then his wife's health grew feebler - she suffered from asthma - and he sold out and went to Oregon, remaining in that state five years. On his return in 1883 he bought a farm in DeKalb county on what is now called the Fair street road. He lived there until his wife's death in 1894, when he made his home with his son, C. M. Goodman on Peeples Street. For several years past Captain Goodman's declining years have kept him from active business. He was hale and vigorous, however, and like a young man in his outlook upon life until about six weeks ago when he suffered a stroke of paralysis. That was the immediate cause of his death.

MARRIED IN DAHLONEGA.

Mr. Goodman married Miss Caroline Mason, at Dahlonega, in 1849. She was the daughter of Dr. D. H. Mason, president of a United States mint that coined \$5 and \$10 gold pieces at the Dahlonega mines prior to the war. The mint was on the site of the present North Georgia Agricultural College.

Though Captain Goodman was of a retiring disposition and took no conspicuous part in politics, he was particular about casting his vote in every election and always voted as a Democrat, even in the day of the Whigs before the war. He was a prominent Mason, being a member of the Georgia lodge and was a Knight Templar. At one time he was treasurer of the Coeur de Leon commandery.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Missing from the obituary was the fact that Mr. Goodman, recently moved from Jefferson, Ga., to Athens, Ga., was instrumental in securing the ether used by Dr. Crawford W. Long in his first operation using ether as anesthetic. Mr. Goodman's deposition today reposes in the National Archives together with other affidavits which proved that Dr. Long was the first person to use ether for anesthesia. A photostat of these documents is on exhibit today in the Crawford Long Museum, at Jefferson, Ga.

DANIEL E. GOODMAN (deceased) was a native of Hart County, Ky., where he was born June 7, 1838. He came to Elkton, Todd Co., with his parents, John A. (deceased) and Sarah E. Goodman (deceased), when a boy, and he was here educated and grew to manhood. For many years his father kept the only hotel in the village of Elkton, the building now owned by Dr. J. L. Woollard, known as the Elkton Inn. Daniel E. was the eldest of a family of twelve children, born to these parents. In early life, Daniel began a mercantile career, in which he was quite successful, first as a grocer, but later in life engaged in the furniture trade. In 1876, he went to Louisville, Ky., to engage in business, but in consequence of lost health was compelled to abandon this, and he returned to Elkton where, on September 25, 1878, he died. Mr. Goodman was a worthy member of the I.O.O.F. and of the Christian Church, and was universally esteemed for his pure life. He was married in Logan County, Ky., March 9, 1859, to Miss Antha L. JOHN LEWIS BOWLING, a native of Hart County, was born October 11, 1840. His father, James M. Bowling, of Hart County, was born in 1810, and in 1831 married Elizabeth Baumgartner; to them were born nine children, six living: James, Martha (Graham), George, John, Thomas and Gaines. Mrs. Elizabeth Bowling is a daughter of Christopher and Elizabeth Baumgartner, the former of whom died in 1866 and the latter in 1881 - both were of German parentage and natives of Virginia. James M. Bowling was a farmer and stock raiser; he served in the war of 1861 as a member of Company E, Third Battery Kentucky Artillery, and died in Louisville, in 1863, soon after his enlistment. He was a son of Edward Bowling, one of the pioneers of Kentucky. John L. Bowling resided on his father's farm until his marriage. His early school training was limited by the circumstance of his time being fully taken up with farming and caring for stock; later in life, however, he has been a great reader, and his mind is stored with a fund of knowledge theoretical as well as practical. His farm of 122 acres is in good condition, very productive and well improved with dwelling, barns and orchard. He was married on the 4th of March, 1868, to Miss Ann M. Goodman. Six children have been born to them; Maud, Millicent, Celia, Aylett, Wyley and Elizabeth.
